

BATLEY LADY'S TROUBLES.

Much sympathy will be extended to Mrs. Walter Nettleton, Beck Lane, Carlinghow, in the loss she has sustained by the death of her youngest son, Harry, of whose death in France she was notified yesterday.

Mr. and Mrs. Nettleton were residing in Wittenberge, Germany, when war broke out, and when it was announced that British civilians were to be interned at Ruhleben, Mrs. Nettleton returned to Batley. Her youngest boy, who was living here, had then joined the Army.

Corporal Nettleton, who was 27 years of age and single, enlisted in the King's Royal Rifles in September, 1914. He went to the Front in July, 1915, and since then has been slightly wounded on two occasions. He had only recently rejoined his regiment after being wounded the second time.

The news of his death arrived yesterday in a letter from his Captain, who writes:—"It is with the deepest regret I have to tell you of the death of your son, who was killed in action on April 10th, by a shell, which killed him instantaneously."
