

Private George Arthur Fox, Batley.

Mrs. G. A. Fox, 6, Devon Street, off Caledonia Road, Batley, has received official intimation that her husband, Private George Arthur Fox, K.O.Y.L.I., was killed in action on April 25th. Deceased, who was 37, enlisted in August, 1914, and took part in several heavy engagements, including the battles of the Somme, the battle of Loos, and the fight for Bapaume. He was admitted to hospital three times—suffering, in turn, from slight wounds, shell-shock, and poisonous gas. His death took place in the region of Arras.

Before the war he was employed at Howley Park Colliery as a bye-worker. He was a member of Batley Trades and Friendly Club, and connected with Hanover Street Congregational Church and P.S.A.

He was a son of the late Mr. Richard Whiteley Fox, of Dewsbury Moor, and his mother now resides at John William Street, Hockmondwike. He leaves a widow and three children.
