

# Two Cross Bank Brothers Killed

Gunner Harry Garside, R.F.A., is the second of the three sons of Mrs. Garside, 175, North Bank Road, Cross Bank, Batley, to fall in action. Corpl. Lewis Garside was killed on July 8th, 1916. Concerning Harry, an officer writes:—"He was seriously wounded on the night of the 27th-28th April. We had him taken to the hospital at once. As his section officer I have nothing but praise for him for his coolness and calm under fire. He always did his duty well and conscientiously.

Gunner Garside died on April 28th. He was 36 and had served seven years in the Regular Army, mainly in India. He went up the day after war broke out, and his late brother Lewis went the same week, as he also fought in the South African War. Previous to enlisting Gunner Garside worked at a Horbury Colliery. He was well-known in Batley, and was connected with Cross Bank Wesleyan Chapel.
