ANOTHER SOUTHILL SOLDIER KILLED

Private John Jackson, Who Had Served a Previous Term in the Army

Official news that Private John Jackson, Durham Light Infantry, was killed in action on June 2nd has been received by his wife at 54 Lady Ann Road, Soothill. Private Jackson, 34 years of age, was called up under the Derby scheme last July, and went to France the following September. He was first attached to the K.O.Y.L.I., but was transferred to the Durham Light Infantry on reaching the Front. He was wounded in the hand ten weeks ago.

For eight years prior to the war Private Jackson was partner in the Batley and District Window Cleaning Co., and very well-known in the district. Previously he had worked as a miner at both Shaw Cross and Chidswell collieries. Deceased, who leaves a widow and two children, was connected with Chickenley Wesleyan Chapel. He had previously served in the Regular Army, and for a considerable time was with the Loyal North Lancashires at Malta.
