

Batley Cloth Finisher's Death.

Mr. and Mrs. John William Summers, Phoenix Mill Yard, Batley, have been informed of the death of their son, Private Harry Summers, H.L.I., by an officer who writes:—

"It is my unpleasant duty to inform you that your son was killed on June 3rd about 4 p.m. We are all sorry to lose him, for he was one of the best and quietest soldiers in my platoon. He was buried in a soldiers' cemetery, and had all the honour due to a brave and gallant soldier as we laid him to rest. A cross, suitably inscribed, marks his resting place. I must offer my sincere heartfelt sympathy in this your hour of trial."

Deceased, who was 26, joined the Army in February last year, prior to which he was employed in Messrs. G. and J. Stubley's finishing place. He had been at the Front two months only when his death occurred. An old boy of Mill Lane Council School, Hanging Heaton, he was also connected with Soothill Congregational Church.
