## Carlinghow Tuner Killed by Sniper Whilst on Guard.

Mrs. Webster, 2, Ealand Road, Carlinghow, has been officially notified that her only son, Private Fred Webster, York and Lancs., was killed in action on June 15th. Two of his pals had previously written to his mother stating that he was killed on that day by a sniper whilst on guard.

Private Webster, who was 28, was called up in June, 1916, and went to the Front last November. He had been employed at Messrs. J., T. and J. Taylor's Blakeridge Mills as a tuner, and had also worked at the firm's Branch Road Mills. Connected with St. John's Church, Carlinghow, he was a former member of the Church Boys' Brigade and of the Church Institute. He was also a member of Carlinghow Working Men's Club.
